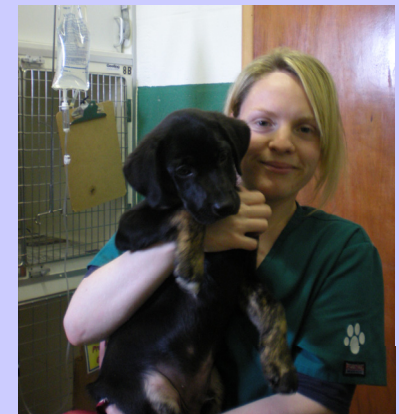

Are you thinking of getting a new pet?

Through our **Pre-purchase Nurse Clinics** you can obtain help and information about what pet would best suit you and your family's needs. Have you considered what breed of dog would fit in with your lifestyle, or where's best to buy a puppy from? Cats and dogs are welcome additions to many homes but often need a lot of understanding with regards to diet, worming, fleas, neutering, vaccinations and training.

And if you have already got your new pet our **Puppy and Kitten Clinics** provide a health check and advice on: vaccinations, worming, fleas, micro-chipping, behaviour, neutering, insurance, pet health plans and nutrition.



Have you noticed some smelly breath?

Dental disease and tooth issues are common problems in our pets. Preventative dental care is essential if we want to keep our pets mouths healthy. Just imagine if you didn't brush your teeth every day! Bring your pet to our **Dental Clinic** for a thorough oral examination and advice what sort of easy dental care is available for your pet, whether it involves veterinary treatment (scale and polish) or easy steps you can take at home there are plenty of things to do to help.



Is your pet approaching a more mature stage in their life?

Did you know that our pets age 7 times faster than we do, and that a dog aged 8 years old is considered 56 years old in human terms?

Growing older is a fact of life, but with it comes an alteration in the needs of your pet and also potential health problems.

Our **Senior Health Check Clinic** pro-

vides a 10 point examination of your pet, a free urine check for diabetes, and advice on topics such as nutrition, exercise, arthritis, dental disease, grooming which may become issues for your pet in their old age.



We recommend pets over the age of 8 should have 6 monthly health checks in an attempt to ensure they keep fit and well. When health problems are recognized early the required

treatment is often easier and more successful for your pet, and less costly to you.

Has your pet recently been diagnosed with Diabetes?

Diabetes can be a confusing disease to understand and requires ongoing medical management and monitoring.

When a diagnosis has been made by a vet our **Diabetes Support Clinic** is provided to support owners as they come to terms with the diagnosis and get to grips with the daily medication that is required.

This support continues as ongoing monitoring is required to ensure the treatment is working and your pet remains stable. Our nurses are able to check your pets weight, analyse urine and take blood required for lab tests.
